CONCEALED CARRY PERMIT & FIREARM PURCHASE TRAINING: This four (4) hour training class provides laws, safe handling of firearms, and all other requirements to satisfy the legal training requirement to purchase any firearm in Washington starting 1 Jan 2024. It also satisfies the legal training requirements for a concealed carry permit issued by **Arizona, Utah** and **Oregon** (no need to be a resident). Some carry permits provide reciprocity (ability to carry) in up to 35 states. Classroom instruction only; no need to bring a firearm.

INSTRUCTOR: GHSC Life Member, **Randon Draper**, is an attorney licensed in Washington and Utah. He is an NRA Certified Pistol and Rifle Instructor and Range Safety Officer. Randon is retired from the military after serving in the Army, Navy and Air Force. He has been a firearm instructor since 2015.

NOTE:
Beginning 1 January 2024, WA HB 1143 requires training covering the following to purchase any firearm:

Basic firearms safety rules; Firearms and children, including secure gun storage and talking to children about gun safety; Firearms and suicide prevention; Secure gun storage to prevent unauthorized access and use; Safe handling of firearms; State and federal firearms laws, including prohibited firearms transfers and locations where firearms are prohibited; State laws pertaining to the use of deadly force for self-defense; and Techniques for avoiding a criminal attack and how to manage a violent confrontation, including conflict resolution.
